The aim of the 'UbiCNS 2005' is to stimulate interactions between Asian researchers on ubiquitous computing & networking systems and real-world computing.

- Acceptance is decided based on the submitted abstract of 100 - 150 words.
- Accepted authors should submit documents which satisfy one of the following:
 - (1) All of papers for this workshop should be written in English.
 - (2) All of papers should be less than or equal to six pages.
 - (3) All of abstracts and presentation materials should be written in English (except for the cover page.)
 - (4) Authors can present either in Korean or Japanese.
